Facebook

Facebook is a social networking website that is operated and privately owned by Facebook, Inc. Since September 2006, anyone over the age of 13 with a valid e-mail address (and not residing in one of the countries where it is banned) can become a Facebook user. ...

Does it feel like everyone that you know is on **Facebook**? Do you want to join, but aren't sure how to start?

Before you can use Facebook, you must create an **account**. Creating a Facebook account is free. All you need to get started is an **email address** and a few minutes of your time.

- Step 1: www.facebook.com
- On Facebook Homepage. Then, enter your full name, your email address and password.
- Your password should include both letters and numbers. Select your gender - Male or Female. Select your birthday.
- After you have entered this data, click on the Signup button. Go to your email that you used to join Facebook. Open the Registration Confirmation email from Facebook. Click on the verification link. Now you can access Facebook and find your friends online.

- If you want, you can now add information about your high school, college, and employer. Click Save & Continue when you're finished.
- Add a picture of yourself to your profile. Click Upload a Photo to select a file from your computer, or Take a Photo to take a new photo with your webcam. If you're not ready to add a profile photo, click Skip.
- You must confirm the email address you used to create your account. Go to your email. You should have received an email from Facebook. Click the link to complete the sign-up process.



If you want to block someone in Facebook, they will not be able to find you through the Find Friends Tool or the Search. If you are in a group with them or are currently friends, your profiles will no longer be connected.

- Enter the person you want to block in the Block field and press the Block button.
- Facebook displays all profiles matching the name that you entered.
- Click Block Person to select the person to block.
- The person's name will now be displayed in the Blocked list on your Privacy tab.
- To unblock someone, click remove next to the blocked person's name.

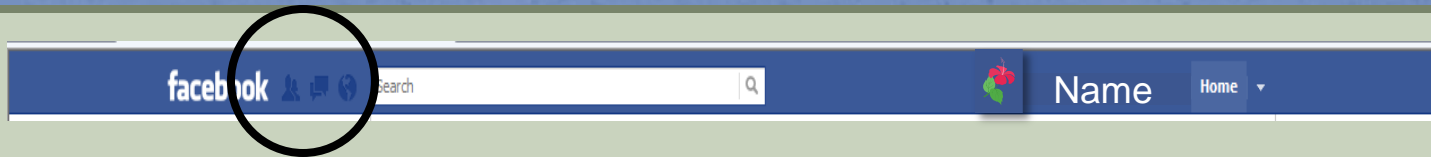

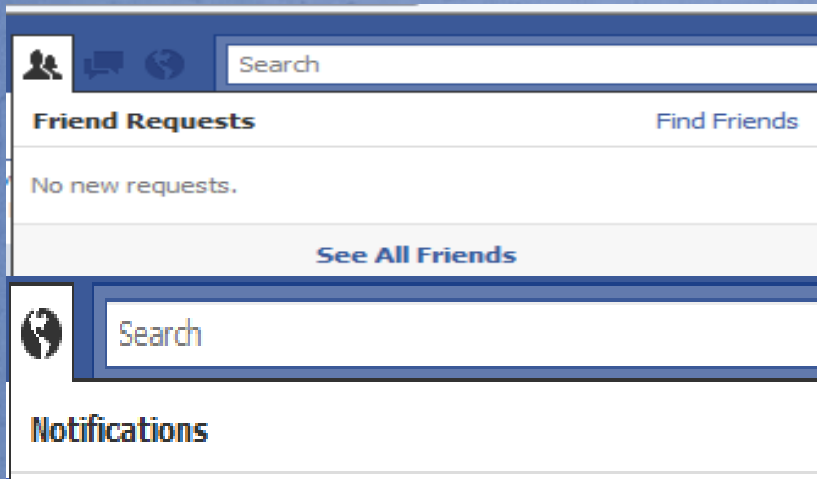

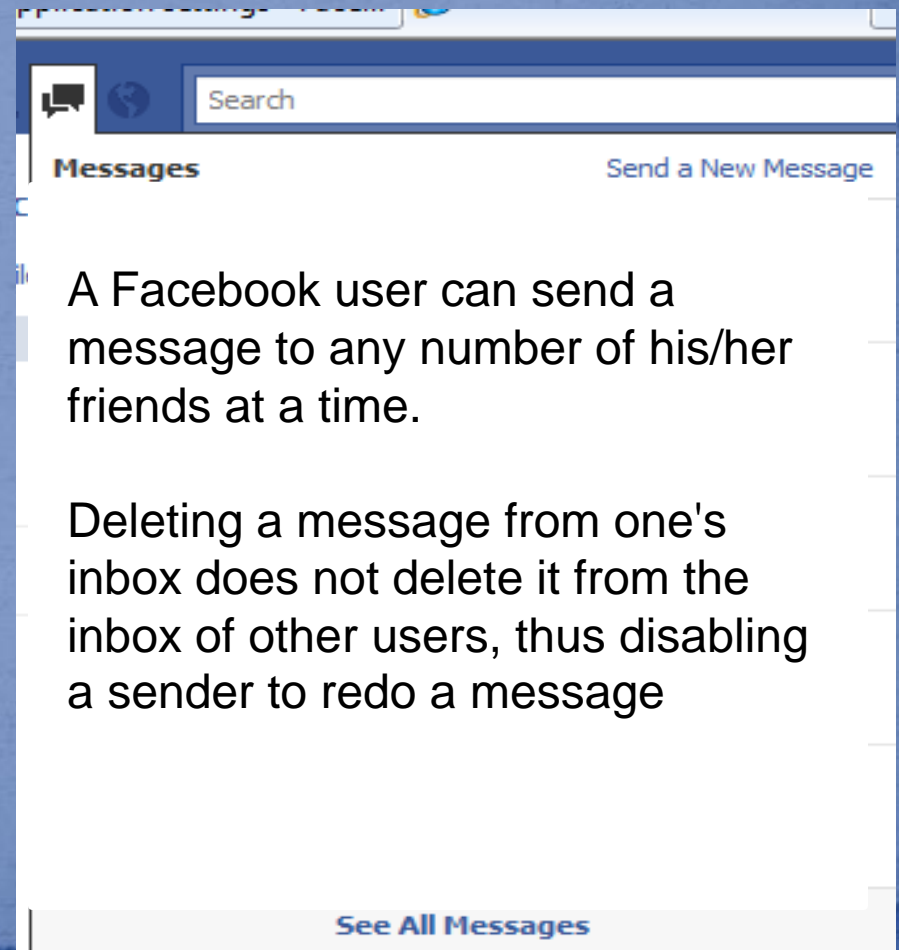
Exploring the Facebook Toolbar and Tabs



The Toolbar at the top your screen lets you navigate through Facebook.



All notifications, friend requests, and new messages will appear in the upper left corner of the site. When you have a new notification, a red bubble will be displayed over the corresponding feature with the number of new notifications you have received.



A Facebook user can send a message to any number of his/her friends at a time.

Deleting a message from one's inbox does not delete it from the inbox of other users, thus disabling a sender to redo a message

Find Friends button

Use the **Friends** button to view your friends, find friends, add new friends and invite people you know to join Facebook.

Friends are people who can see your status updates, access your profile and receive news feeds about you. Most people approve people as Facebook friends if they are people they know in real life. If someone wants to add you to their friends list, you must approve them before they can access your profile. If you add someone as a friend, they must also approve you before you can see their profile information.

Find Friends Using the People You May Know Tool

- Facebook displays people who may know based on mutual friends, high school, college, networks, and employment similarities.
- Facebook lists potential friends on your Facebook page and on the Find People You Know on Facebook screen.
- If you do not want the person displayed in the People You May Know section, click on the X to the right of their name.
- To add the person displayed as a friend], click Add as Friend.
- If you want to add a personal message with your friend request, click Add a Personal Message.
- To add as a friend, click on the Add Friend button.
- An email is sent to the friend for them to approve your request to be added as a friend.

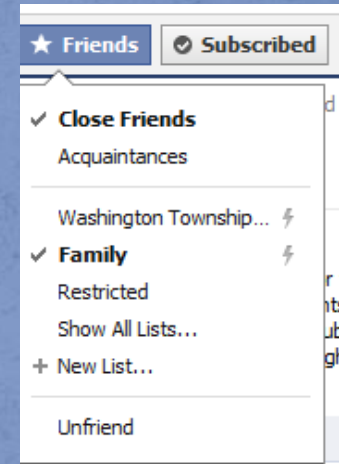
Accept Friends

If someone adds you as a friend, you must accept approve them as a friend before they can access your profile. If you have selected to be notified by email on your Settings tab, you will be sent an email. There will also be a message at the top right of your home page that says You have [X] Friend Request.

- Click on You have [X] Friend Requests.
- To add the person], click on the Add Friend button.
- The person is now a friend and can access your profile. You will begin to receive news and stories about your new friend
- If you do not want to add the person as a friend, click on the Ignore button. The person is not notified that you ignored them.

Remove a Friend

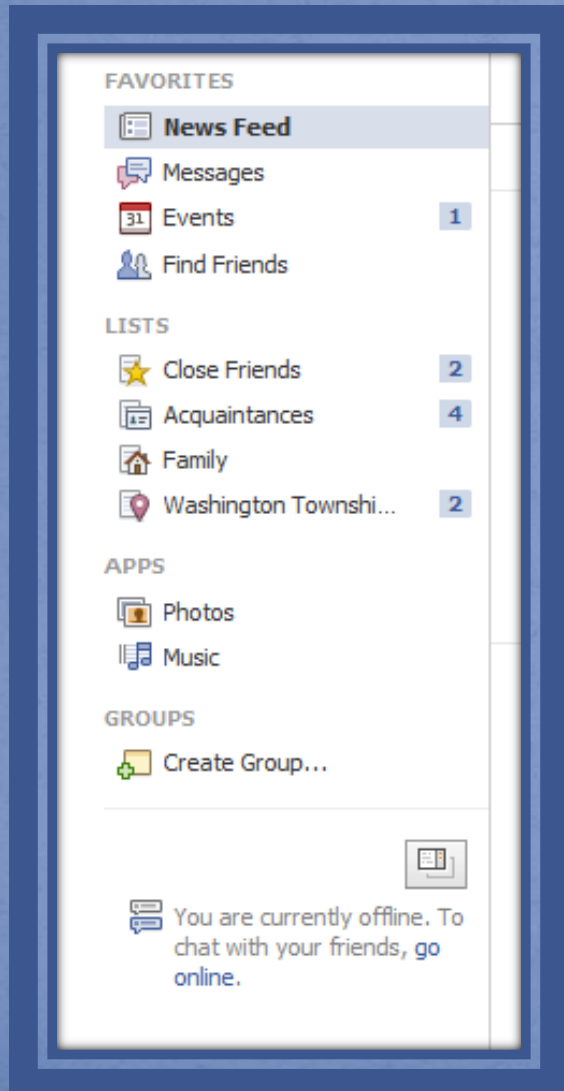
- you no longer want to be friends with a person, you can remove them from your friends list. You can do this by clicking on their name on your Wall or News Feed. You can also select View All Friends from the Friends menu and click on the link to their profile.
- A message box asking if you want to remove them is displayed. To remove them, click on the Unfriend button.



Facebook Buttons

- **News Feed** - This tab displays stories about your friends, such as when they add friends, post updates or write a friends wall. The amount of information displayed about a friend depends on their privacy settings. You can customize the amount of news] that you receive about a particular friend in your News Feed.
- **Status Updates** - This tab displays status updates posted by your friends. It does not include other stories about your friends, such as when they join a group or add a new friend.
- **Photos** - This tab displays your friend's photo albums. The photo albums displayed in this tab depends on the privacy setting selected for the photo album.
- **Links-** Individuals or companies can create "Like Pages" which allows fans of an individual, organization, product, service, or concept to join a Facebook fan club.
- **Pages-** Pages are for organizations, businesses, celebrities, and bands to broadcast great information in an official, public manner to people who choose to connect with them.
- **Questions-** On March 24, 2011, Facebook announced that its new product - Facebook Questions - facilitates short, poll-like answers in addition to long-form responses

Left Side Application Filters



Apps on Facebook are designed to enhance your experience on the site with engaging games and useful features like Events and Photos. Some apps are built by Facebook developers, but most are built by outside developers who use Facebook's APIs and abide by Facebook's Developer Principle and Policies.

Apps on Facebook allow you to play social games with your friends, remember friends' birthdays, share your taste in movies, send gifts to friends, and much more

Dashboard and Games


Dashboard has been added to make it easier for you to interact with your favorite applications and games, as well as discover new ones. The dashboards allow you to view the latest applications or games with which you and your friends have interacted.

Additionally, the Games Dashboard is a dedicated space for games on Facebook, so you can receive personalized updates from your applications to remind you if it's your turn in a game or to let you know that a friend has taken an action in that application. To access the dashboard for an application or game, simply click on that application in your left navigation column

Events

- Whether you're having a yard sale, planning a class reunion, planning a surprise party, or announcing a fundraiser you can use the Events application to get the word out. You may choose to invite a whole network or a few close friends.

This Application also allows you to see upcoming events in your community, see your Friends' Events, view Past Events, and keep up with your Friends' Birthdays. Using Events is a great way to save paper and get the word out about your upcoming festivities!

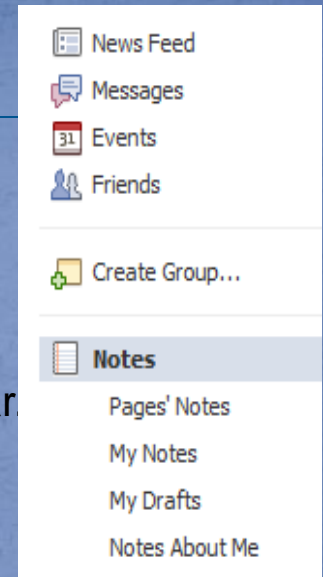

Add Notes

You can write notes on your profile similar to a blog for your friends to read. You can also import an existing blog into Facebook Notes.

- To access Notes, click the Notes icon in the Application section or toolbar.
- To enter a new note, click Write New Note.
- Enter the title of the note, body and people you want to tag in the note.
- Tag people who are mentioned in the note.
- Select who you want to be able to see the note in the Note privacy section.
- To save a draft of the note without publishing it, click the Save Draft button.
- To see what the note will look like before you publish it, click the Preview button.
- To publish the note, click the Publish button.



Create a Group

If you do not find a group that you want to join, you can also create a group for a specific interest or group of people.

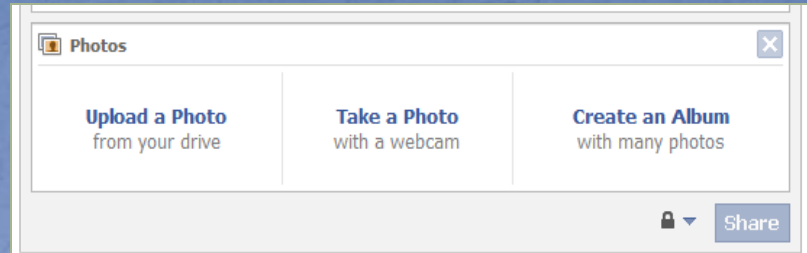
- Click on the **Groups** icon in the Application section or toolbar.

- To create a new group, click the **Create a New Group** button.
- Enter the name of the group. Be sure to enter a name that describes the purpose of the group.

Join Groups

Groups allow you to meet and interact people with common interests or beliefs. A group can be for people who support the same sports team, attend the same church or like the same television show. Be sure to look for business and professional groups that would help with professional networking.

- You can join an existing group or create your own groups. You can join up to 300 groups.
- Click on the Groups icon in the Application section or toolbar.
- The Groups page is displayed. A list of your friends groups and the groups that you belong to is displayed.
- To join a group that one of your friends belong to, click on the group and then click Join Group.
- You are now a member of the group.
- To find an existing group, enter a keyword in the Search field.
- A list of groups matching your search is displayed.
- Click Join Group to join the group.


Add Photos



Many people use Facebook to search photo album. Once you add photo albums, a Photos tab is added to your profile.] You can specify specific privacy options

- Click the Create Album button.

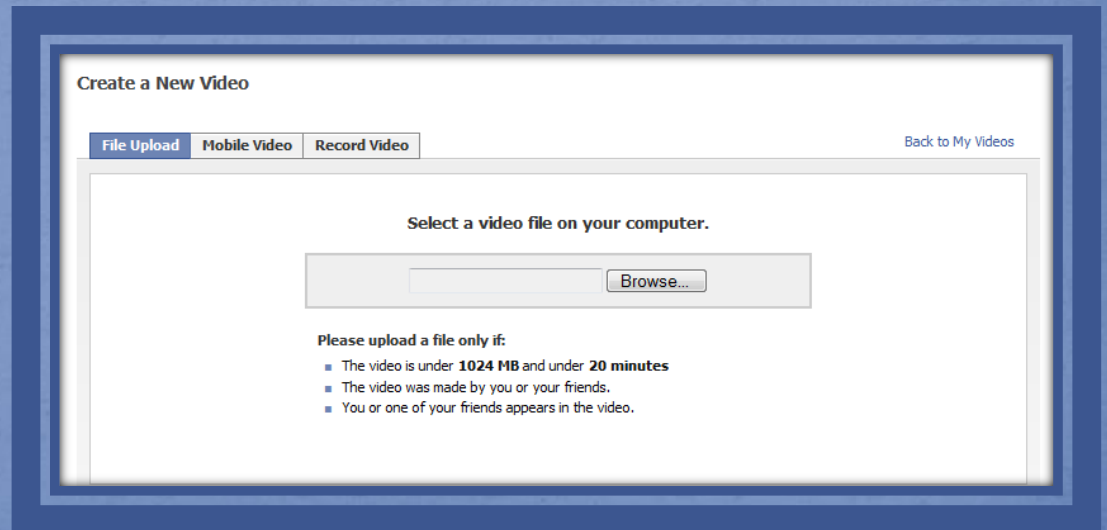
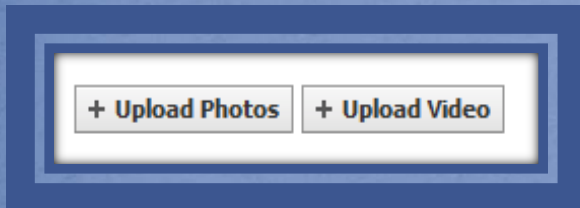

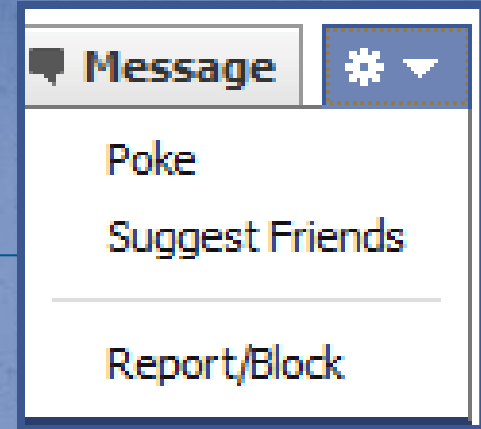

Poke a Friend

Another way to communicate on Facebook is to poke a friend. You can use pokes to say hi to an existing friend or to allow a person who is not a friend access to basic information about you.

- Access the person's Facebook page.
- Click on Poke A confirmation message is displayed.
- Click the Poke button.
- Your friend is notified that you poked them when they log into Facebook.



How to Chat

- You can see which friends are online by clicking the Chat menu
- You can see which friends are online by clicking the Chat menu at the bottom right of any Facebook page. A green dot will appear next to a friend who is online and available to chat, and a moon will appear next to a friend who is currently idle. On profiles and anywhere else on the site, clicking on a chat icon will start a conversation with that person.

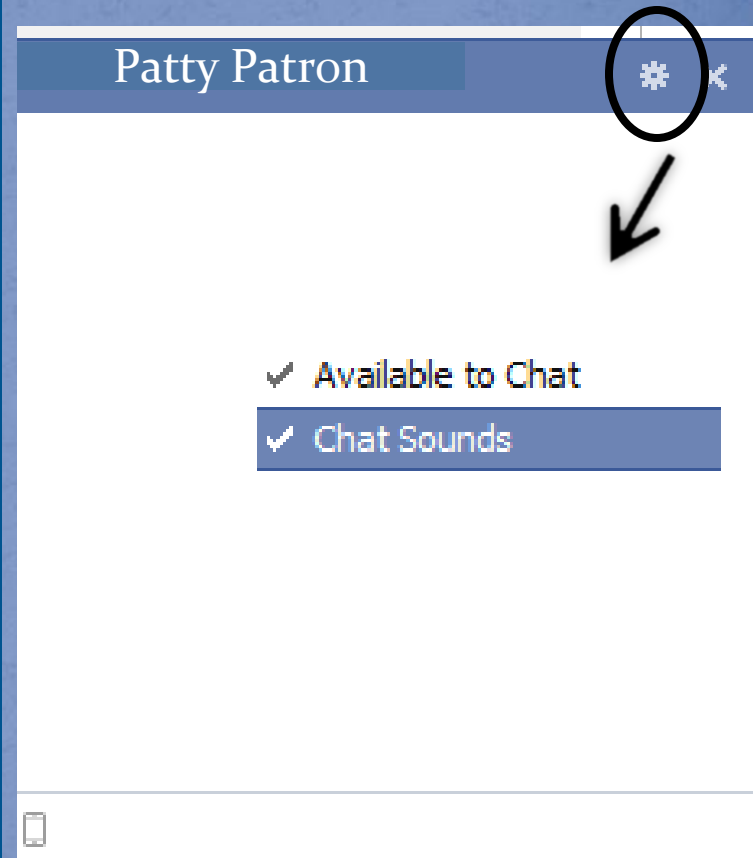
To send a Chat message, simply type your message and then press "Enter" or "Return" on your computer keyboard.

Please note you can only message with your confirmed friends using Facebook Chat.

Chat with a Friend

You can chat with friends who are online through Facebook Chat. The Friends Online button in the bottom right of the Facebook screen tells you how many friends are online.

- To see which friends are online, click the Online Friends button.
- A list of friends currently online is displayed. A green dot next to the friend means that they are currently active and a moon means that the friend is idle.
- Click on the name of the friend you want to chat with.
- Facebook Chat is displayed. If you have previously chatted with the friend, your previous chat conversation is shown in the chat window.
- Type in your message to your friend and press the Enter key.
- The message is sent to your friend.
- When they respond, their message is displayed in the Chat window.
- When you are finished chatting, click the Close icon in the top right of the Chat window.




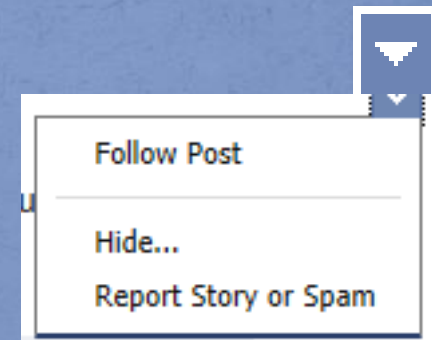
Write on a Friends Wall

You can have wall-to-wall conversations with your friends by posting on their wall. When you write a friend's, remember that their friends can view what you are writing. If you have your privacy postings to show when you write on friend's wall in your news feeds, your friends will also see what you have written.

- Access your friend's Facebook page.
- In the Write field, enter your message to your friend.
- Click the Post button. The message is posted to your friend's wall.

How do I remove a Wall post or story?

- To remove a post or story from your Wall:
Hover your mouse over the story or post in question.
- Click the  button that appears to the right of post.
- Click the dropdown menu.
- Choose Setting choose.

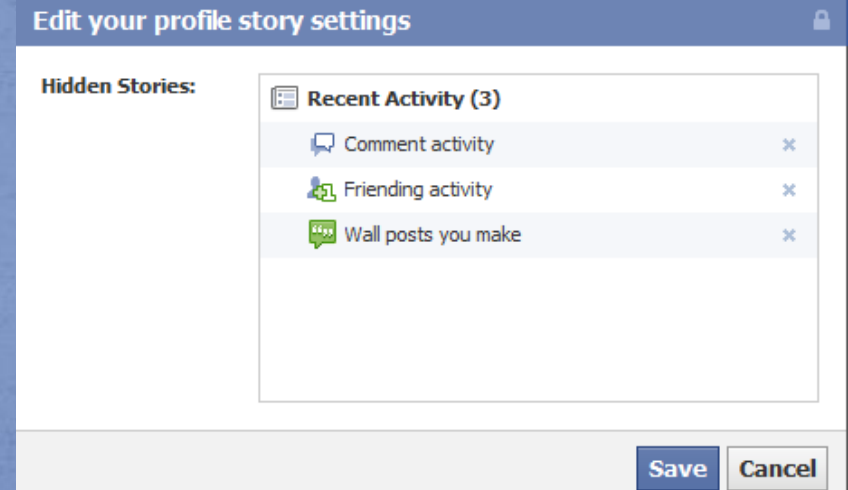

Removing and Reporting Tags

If you don't like a tag that someone adds, you have many options:

- Remove it from your profile. Your profile represents who you are, so you control what appears on it. You can even update your privacy settings to review things you're tagged in *before* they go on your profile.
- Remove the tag or report the post. You can easily:
 - Remove the tag. The post will still be on Facebook, but it will no longer link to your profile.
 - Send the owner of the post a message, asking to remove the post from Facebook.
 - Report a post to Facebook. If the post is abusive, it will be removed.
 - Block the owner of the post. All tags from this person will be removed, and you will no longer be able to see or interact with each other on Facebook.

How do I turn on the option to review posts and photos I'm tagged in before they appear on my profile?

- If you'd like to review posts and photos you're tagged in before they go on your profile, turn on Profile Review.
- Go to Account > Privacy Settings > Manage How Tags Work > Change Settings > Profile Review.

If you have Profile Review off, then tags from **friends** are automatically approved. Whether you have Profile Review on or not, tags from **nonfriends** require your approval before they go on your profile.

How do I restrict an app from accessing my information?

- If you have allowed an app to access your information, you can restrict what it can access by going to the Application Settings page. Or, if you'd like, you can remove the app from your profile.

Once you have removed an app from your profile, it will no longer be able to access any of your information going forward (unless you are allowing your information to be accessible through your friends via the "Info accessible through your friends" setting).

To prevent a specific app from accessing any of your information, you can block the app.

Keep in mind that if you'd like the information that you've shared with the app to be permanently deleted from their records, you will need to contact the developer directly.

Where do the Pages I've added display on my profile?

The Pages that you Like will be displayed on the bottom of the Info tab of your profile. If your search visibility allows Pages to be displayed to non-friends, they will also see this information when they find you in search. You can control this from the Search section of your Privacy Settings page.

Can I hide the Pages I Like from my profile?

currently facebook does not allow users to hide the pages they like from their friends. However, facebook plans to provide more robust privacy controls for Pages in the future

To Deactivate Your Account

- To deactivate your account: Open the Account dropdown menu at the top right corner of Facebook and choose **Account Settings**.
- Select Security from the left-hand menu.
- Click on "Deactivate your account."
- When you deactivate your account, your profile and all information associated with it disappears from the Facebook service immediately. People on Facebook will not be able to search for you or view any of your information.
- If you'd like to come back to Facebook anytime after you've deactivated your account, you can reactivate your account by logging in with your email and password. Your profile will be restored in its entirety (friends, photos, interests, etc.). Remember that you will need to have access to the login email address for your account in order to reactivate it.

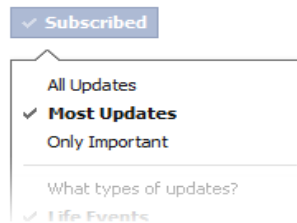

Common Questions

Why do all my friends have a 'Subscribed' button?

You've always been subscribed to your friends. With the Subscribe button, you can choose which of their updates you get.

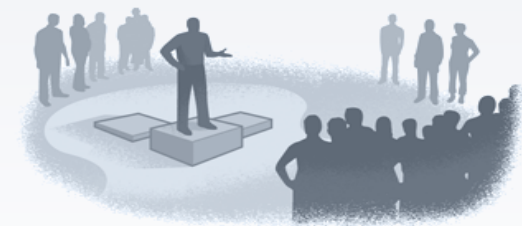
Why don't all profiles have a Subscribe button?

Only people who allow subscribers will have a Subscribe button on their profile. If you don't see the button, you can't subscribe.

Allow Subscribers



Allowing subscribers is a simple way to broaden your conversation on Facebook, while reserving personal updates for people you know well.

How do people subscribe to my updates?


After you allow subscribers, a Subscribe button will show up on your profile. Your public updates will appear in people's News Feeds once they click this button.

If I allow subscribers, what updates will they see?

Subscribers can see **only** the things you share publicly. They can also choose how many and what types of these public updates they get.





Mobile text on Facebook

Activating Mobile Texts

You can go to the Mobile tab of your Account Settings page to activate Mobile Texts. Click "Register for Facebook Text Messages" and complete the steps that follow.

If I use my phone number to confirm my identity, will it appear in my profile?

You can control whether your mobile phone number appears on your profile

You can control whether your mobile phone number appears on your profile using Facebook's Privacy Settings page. This page is also accessible from the Account drop-down menu at the top of any Facebook page.

I didn't receive a confirmation code to activate Mobile Texts.

First, check the Mobile page for more information about whether your carrier is supported. Your carrier is supported if it is listed in the drop-down menu that appears when you click "Sign Up for Facebook Text Messages."

How much does it cost?

Facebook does not charge you for using Mobile Texts. However, your mobile

Facebook does not charge you for using Mobile Texts. However, your mobile provider's standard rates for sending and receiving text messages still apply.

When I get a long message, it says "N" for next. What does that mean?

To read the rest of your message, just reply to the text message you r...

To read the rest of your message, just reply to the text message you received with the letter "n" (without quotes). You should also make sure that your phone does not include a signature at the end of your text messages.

How can I Deactivate Mobile Texts?

To stop Facebook notifications from being sent to your phone, you can... To stop Facebook notifications from being sent to your phone, you can simply text "Off" (without quotation marks) to the number that you send your status updates to. Alternatively, you can go to the Mobile tab of your Account Settings page and change your settings to "Off." Note that you can still send text messages to the same number to update your status or take actions Facebook.

Can I still send texts to Facebook Mobile Texts if I turn Facebook texts off?

Turning your Facebook texts on/off refers only to the text notifications that you receive when someone pokes, messages, writes on your Wall, or adds you as a friend. Even if you turn off your text notifications, you can always send texts to the Facebook Mobile Texts number to update your status, message a friend, or write on a friend's Wall. You can also always send a text to this number to look up information or perform an action.

To set your language, go to the bottom of the page you are on and click on the current language (in the left corner). Choose a new language from the menu.

You can also update your language on the Account Settings page:

1. Open the account dropdown menu at the top right corner of Facebook and choose Account Settings.

2. Next to Language, click the [Edit](#) link.

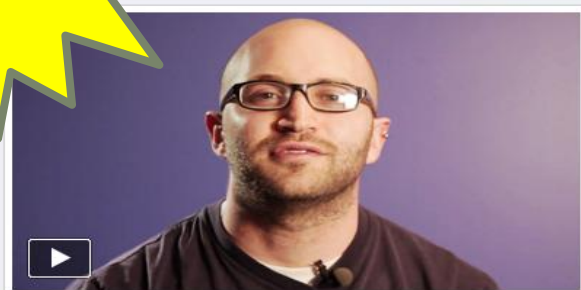

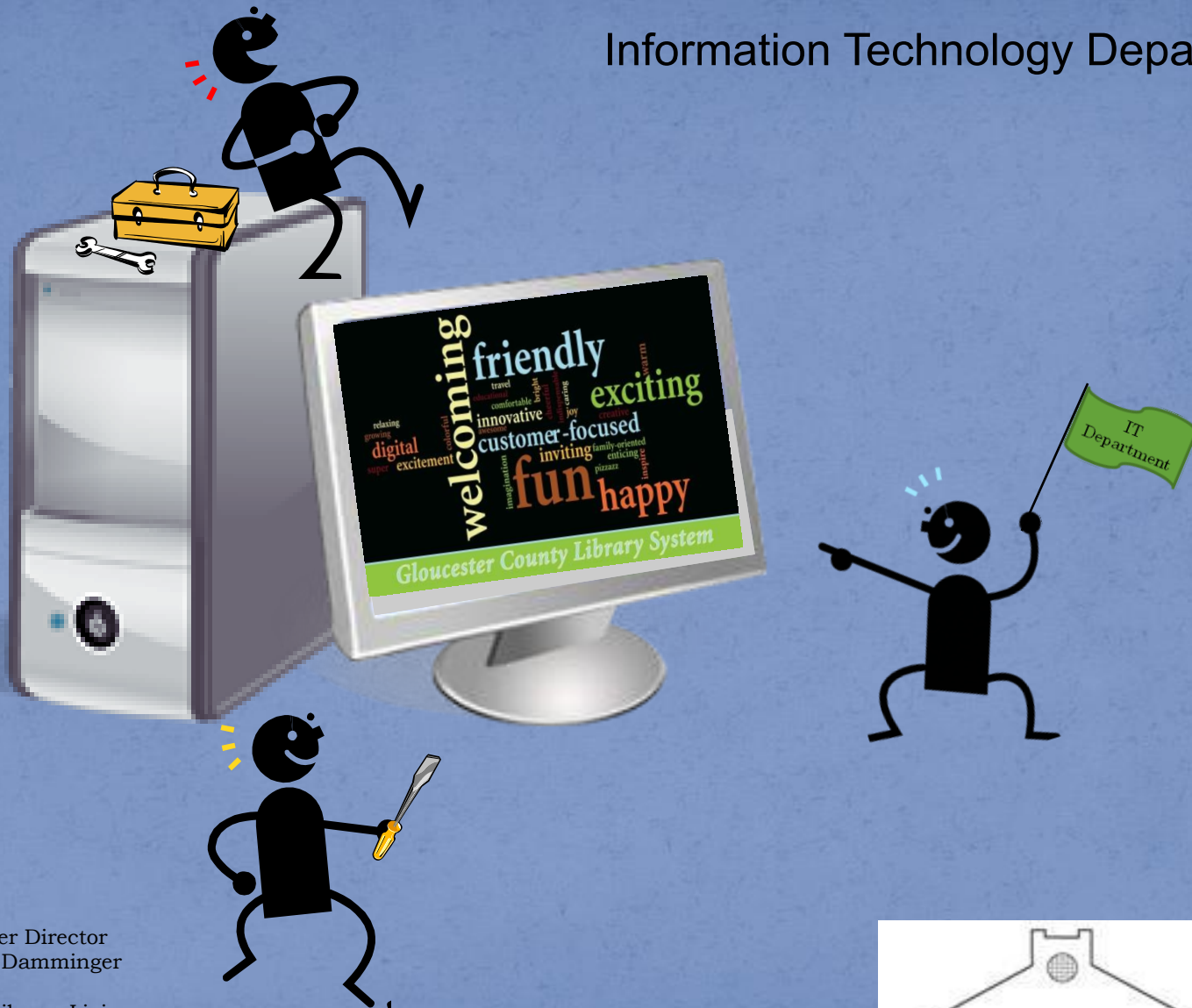
